IC AUTHORIZES FAMILY RADIO SERVICE IN CANADA

Industry Canada has just released a policy paper
governing the use of Licence-Exempt Family Radio Devices in
the Land Mobile Frequency Sub-bands 462 - 467 MHz. This
band is used by commercial mobile operators as well as public
safety services.

The Family Radio Service (which has become very
popular in the USA as a new, UHF "Citizens Band") will use
unlicensed transmitters operating at low power, on the
understanding that they will not cause interference to the licensed
services.

Since the upper limit of the Canadian 70 cm Amateur
band is 450 MHz, it is not likely that the FRS will interfere with
Amateur operations.

commemoration for the heroes of Camp X - with the return of
Camp X to the air. Camp X was where 'secret agents' trained
before being parachuted into Nazi occupied territory to not only
lead the resistance movement, but to provide valuable
information to invading Allied Armies.

This event will commemorate the fifty-fifth anniversary
of VE Day, May 8, 2000. The event is being presented as a local
Amateur Radio initiative, in co-operation with the Camp X
Historical Society of Whitby.

CROSS BAND EVENT - PORTISHEAD RADIO GKA TO CLOSE

BT Radio Services have announced that Portishead Radio and all of the VHF stations will close at 1200z on Sunday 30 April. The MF stations will close at 1200z on Friday 30 June. Portishead Radio first came on air 80 years ago in 1920 and was to become the largest communications centre in the world. It employed over 340 people and was the CW and RT centre for the Commonwealth.

BT Maritime Services have agreed to run a special cross band maritime/amateur event on Saturday 29th April 2000. The details are as follows:
