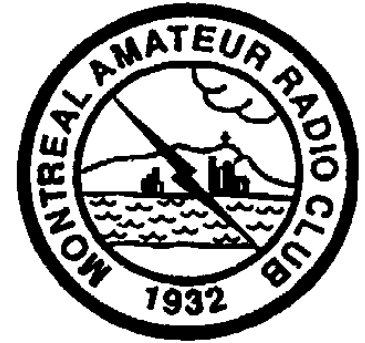

The MARC 70th anniversary dinner was held
Saturday October 19th, 2002 at the Antico Martini
Restaurant. Those who attended were treated to a great
evening. We had the chance to make new acquaintances as
well as catch up with old acquaintances while enjoying a first
class meal. We also had a chance to see the new book on the
history of amateur radio in Quebec, "L'Histoire du Monde
Radioamateur au Quebec - Tome 1" by Jean-Guy Renaud,
VE2AIK. The author was in attendance so a few people
were able to purchase autographed copies of this
informative book.

The highlight of the dinner was a presentation by
Dr. John (Jack) Belrose, VE2CV. Dr. Belrose gave an
interesting talk on the first Trans-Atlantic Radio
transmissions by Guglielmo Marconi and Reginald

Fessenden as well as overview of the equipment used including the limitations of the designs, and doubts about the success of Marconi's Trans-Atlantic communications.

After the presentation there was an interesting question and answer period going into some more details about Fessenden, Marconi, and Tesla.

SEPTEMBER MEETING RECAP

RAC PRESENTATION

Radio Amateurs of Canada at the M.A.R.C. September 25, 2002 meeting.

At the September 25th meeting of the Montreal Amateur Radio Club, James G. Dean, VE3IQ (Vice President, Regulatory Affairs - Radio Amateurs of Canada) and Dr. Kenneth Pulfer, VE3PU (Vice President, Government and International Affairs - Radio Amateurs of Canada) spoke on the various regulatory topics that will be discussed at next year's World Radio Conference (WRC-2003). Of prime interest to users/listeners on/around 7

MHz, the push for a world-wide Amateur exclusive allocation that is 300KHz wide at or near 7000 - 7300 KHz. This will mean that finally the 40-metre band will be the same in all three ITU regions.

Section S.25 (the Morse Code requirement for HF operation) is also to be discussed at WRC-2003, but it's passage at this time appears to be uncertain given the priority that the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) is giving to the 40-metre question. As well, there is at least one country that is opposed to any change in S.25.

They also gave a brief look at various local problems/threats including the possible loss of spectrum at 220-222 MHz in Canada, the problems of primary status in the bands 144 MHz and up, interference from low-powered, unlicensed devices and the threat in Europe of Power Distribution companies using High Voltage power lines to deliver internet and phone service which could cause interference to the HF bands.

Ken Pulfer will be attending the WRC-2003 Conference next year as part of IARU delegation. The IARU only has Observer Status at WRC-2003 but works though local National Member Societies working hand in hand with Regulatory Agencies such as Industry Canada (IC) and the (U.S.) Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in helping guide through and formulate proposals to help and protect Amateur Radio interests. Jim Dean will also be attending as a member of the Canadian delegation.

Please consider contributing to the Defence of Amateur Radio Fund via RAC as there are many important issues that need our attention and with many band threats (particularly above 30 MHz), it is extremely important that something be done to save our spectrum for future use and experimentation.

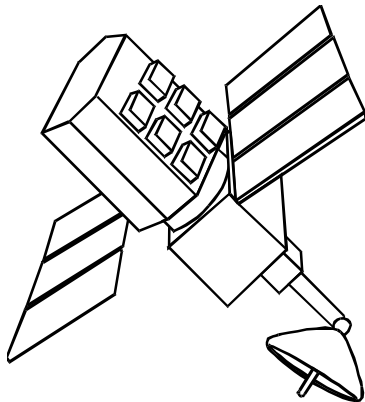

AMSAT OSCAR 7 AO-7 NEWS

The Amsat Oscar 7 AO-7 Satellite has recently come back to life after being dormant for over twenty years. The satellite had significant Canadian involvement. The Canadian AMSAT team spent thousands of hours supporting the design, especially Larry Kayser VE3LK, Dick Bonnycastle VE3FUA and Bob Pepper VA3BI (EX VE2AO) who was involved in the design of the 435.1MHz Beacon in 1973! TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Uplink: 145.850 to 145.950 MHz CW/SSB
Downlink: 29.400 to 29.500 MHz CW/SSB



Beacon: 29.502 MHz, 145.975 MHz
Launched: November 15, 1974 by a Delta 2310 from Vandenberg Air Force Base, Lompoc, California.
Status: Semi-operational in sunlight.

After being declared dead 21 years ago in mid

1981 due to battery failure, AO-7 has miraculously sprung back to life and was first detected by Pat Gowen, G3IOR on June 21, 2002 at 1728 UTC. Jan King, W3GEY reports AO-7 is almost certainly running only off the solar panels. It is very likely to be on only when in the sun and off in eclipse. Therefore, AO-7 will reset each orbit and may not turn on each time. It is in Mode A when the 29.502 MHz beacon is detected.

On July 11, 2002 AO-7 was successfully commanded for the first time since it was declared dead 21 years ago. Commands were sent and accepted to change the CW beacon code speed.

Command investigation continues. So far, 11 different commands have been accepted by AO-7.

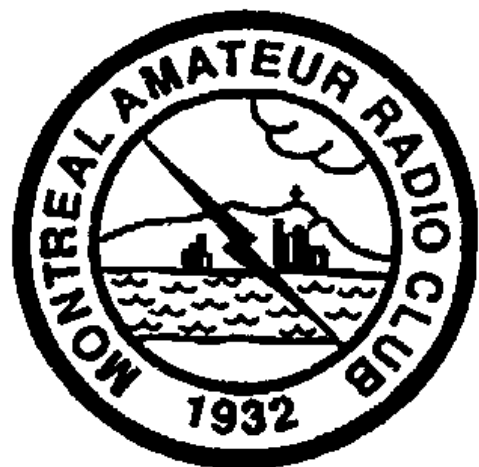
