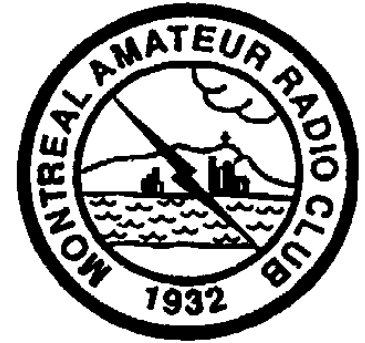

JAY CHALLENGE

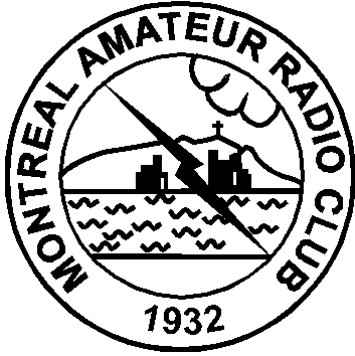

The purpose of this directed net is to provide emergency auxiliary communication to local and state government in the Northern New York area, also to include training, skywarn, and public service operations. All areas including Canada and Vermont are encouraged to participate in the training nets and activations.

Most training traffic is weather reports with sky conditions first, followed by precipitation, followed by
