REMEMBERING ROBERT BENSON VE2VW (1922 - 2014)

Bob Benson, a long time member of the Montreal Amateur Radio Club, passed away on December 25th. 2014. For the members who knew him, the club and amateur radio in general lost a valued friend and asset to the club. Bob, was a graduate of both McGill and Harvard. He was a successful lawyer. He also served in the Royal Canadian Air Force working on radar installations and was stationed in Gander, Newfoundland. He always had his hands in electronics and radios, no matter what he did. He served as the chief counsel to the Canadian Radio Relay League (CRRL) now Radio Amateurs of Canada.

One of the major services that Bob did for Canadian Amateurs, was to petition the Government, not to impose duty

on amateur radio equipment, since it was used to help the development of radio technology. To this day, this benefits amateurs throughout Canada. When he was living on Lansdowne Avenue in Westmount, he had his home station and antennas. Many a neighbour, not knowing about amateur radio, looked upon his antennas as an eyesore. But it was at his home station, VE2MBS/VE2QQ and I have operated the control station for the that took him around the world.
