I will be one of the two Canadian representatives along with Chet Latawiec VE3CFK and we are working with the CSA and ARISS Executive in planning for the meeting.

While formal voting is limited to the 12 official representatives others interested in ARISS are welcome to attend. We don't know who in the Montreal area has been involved in ARISS or would like to be so we hope to get the word out through contacts to clubs and people we know. We expect about 30 people to attend

SolderSpot

Group build Power Supply Project - By Leo VE2SI

The Power Supply will provide a variable output between 1 volt and 20 volts approx., deliver at least 750mA and have digital output meters for the voltage and current. An LM-317 three-terminal voltage regulator is the heart of the power supply.

The SolderSpot kit will include all the parts for the Power Supply and participants will be asked to bring whatever tools, such as a soldering iron, they might have. It should be possible to assemble the kit within six 2-hour sessions.

Each build session will open with a short description of the work to be done and the relevant design considerations. As well as the PS that each participant will build, the project will provide an introduction to electronic circuit construction and a more detailed view of the way that a linear power supply is designed.

Each country will report on activities in the past year and the group as a whole will consider plans for the future including possible amateur radio participation in the next big international project, Gateway, that will be a small station orbiting the moon to support manned and unmanned activities on the moon.

The meeting focusses on using amateur radio from space for education. While Canadian ARISS activities traditionally have focused on facilitating contacts where astronauts answer questions from primary or secondary students ARISS activities in other parts of the world extend to the use of the space station for projects of students at the post secondary level as well. ARISS Europe, working with the European Space Agency, is developing infrastructure on the Space Station using raspberry Pis and software defined radio to conduct experiments designed by students and using the amateur radio equipment on the space station to transmit data back to earth.

The meeting also provides an opportunity to strengthen the contacts between the amateur radio community in Canada and the CSA. Bob Thirsk, a former Canadian astronaut and avid supporter of amateur radio educational activities like ARISS is returning to the Space Agency. If he is in Montreal and available we hope to have him speak at the meeting.

As Secretary of MARC and of RAQI I hope you can help pass the word. Please let others you thing would be interested know about the event and me know who we should contact.


