

He always copied the ARRL Field Day message for us, helped with setup and teardown, and often operated CW during the night.

James R. Hay VE2VE, 1960 - 2012, SK

It is with deep regret that we inform you of the death of James R. Hay, VE2VE, long-time member of the MARC. Jim had just moved into a new apartment but was unable to enjoy it for long. Jim died 22 October 2021 at the Teresa Dellar Palliative Care Residence (formerly known as West Island Palliative Care Residence) after battling cancer and other medical conditions for several years. His half-brother Dave Wilson was with him.

A Morse code operator's unique way of sending CW is called his "fist" and in Jim's case this individuality extended to his helpful personality. Jim's key is now silent, his station is QRT for the last time, and we have lost an enthusiastic volunteer and promoter of amateur radio.

Born 10 May 1960, Jim graduated from John Rennie High School in Pointe-Claire in 1977, went to CEGEP Vanier College from 1977 to 1980 earning a diploma in Social Studies, then attended Concordia University from 1984 to 1996, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in History and Library Studies.

Jim was heavily involved with the MARC, having joined the club about 23 years ago. He sat on the Board and was a member of the Executive in various positions for many years. He was a moving spirit in the Club's ARRL Field Day operations, providing support and guidance for a variety of activities, and organizing volunteer amateur radio communications for the annual St. Patrick's Day parade, run by the United Irish Societies of Montreal.

Jim manned the MARC table at any hamfest within range, promoting the club and amateur radio to anyone who expressed an interest. Jim also provided the expertise to set up the web page for the MARC and kept its information up to date. At various times, Jim was a director for Radio Amateurs of Canada (RAC), and deputy director for Radio Amateurs de Quebec Inc (RAQI). Jim publicized and organized the MARC fleamarket, and his list of venues and contact people for those venues was extensive. Jim also worked with VE2MAB operators and provided insights and knowledge to the visually challenged group. Latterly, Jim was teaching the MARC Basic course of instruction, by Zoom due to COVID-19, leading to at least 10 new amateur radio operators.

What really made Jim a stand-out amongst others in the radio community was his technical understanding. He was well versed in operating procedures and very knowledgeable about the safe operation of a station. He held various radio licenses, Radiotelephone Operators restricted Certificate Maritime (1982), the same in the field of Aeronautics (1992), Amateur Radio Operators Certificate Basic and Advanced (1992). His list of amateur radio callsigns is impressive: VE2CRM (Quebec division of the Red Cross), VE2ILE, VE2MBS (his friend the late Vern's callsign), VE2TCP, VE2VVV, and the ultimate callsign, VE2VE.

Jim loved boating, specifically yachting, and was a member of the Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons (CPS) and was also on their Executive for many years. He taught a course in Marine Electronics from 1985-1988 and wrote a monthly column "High Seas Radio" for the Monitoring Times magazine from 1982-1996.

He and his close friend the late Vern Ikeda VE2MBS/VE2QQ were avid train spotters and dabbled in spotting fire, police, and ambulance teams as they handled calls. Jim took the time to understand how they worked, and even knew what kind of equipment was carried by fire trucks, down to the type of siren they had! Jim also had a more than passing interest in genealogical research, both into his own ancestors and those of others, sometimes locating missing heirs to estates in Canada and the U.S., producing reports, and performing archival searches for others.

There is much more that could be written about Jim's many talents. What is most important to note is that the Montreal amateur radio community has lost not just a member, but a repository of knowledge and skills that Jim would bring to bear on problems. Jim, we hope all signals are Q59 and there is no QRM, QRN or QSB wherever you are. You will be missed greatly.




