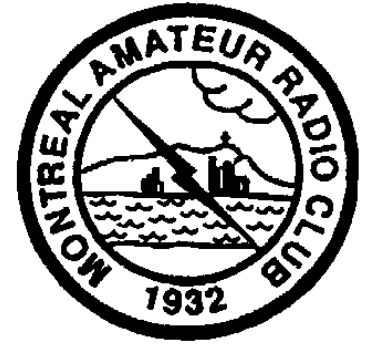

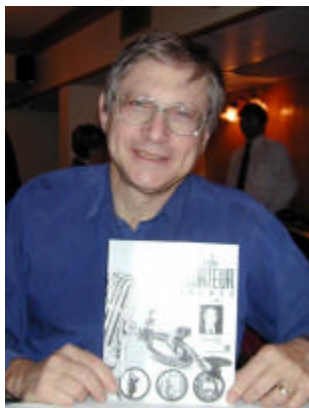

RADIO AMATEURS OF CANADA BULLETINS

Subject: RAC Bulletin 02-081E Industry Canada To Conduct Public Consultation On Towers

RAC President Bill Gillis has delegated Regulatory Affairs VP, Jim Dean, VE3IQ, to organize and present RAC's official response to the public consultation announced by Industry Minister Alan Rock on 31 October. Tim Ellam, VE6SH, will assist VP Dean with legal expertise developed in successfully defending a number of tower cases.

Radio Amateurs wishing to submit any comment or information on tower issues are requested to address their input to VP Dean via e-mail at ve3iq@rac.ca. RAC will keep you informed of developments through TCA and future RAC Bulletins.

Subject: RAC Bulletin 02-085E 5 MHz Experiment

The Marconi Amateur Radio Club of Newfoundland, under the leadership of Joe Craig, VO1NA, will conduct a three phase propagation experiment at approximately 5.3 MHz. The three phases have been authorized for 22-25 November 2002, 20-23

December 2002, and 20-23 June, 2003. The call sign will be VO1MRC. Planned frequencies and modes are CW (A1A) and USB SSB (J3E) on: 5260, 5269, 5280, 5290, 5319 and 5329 and possibly 5400 and 5405 KHz.

Subject: RAC Bulletin 02-084E - SONRA Participates in Trans-Atlantic VHF Experiment

Between November 17 and 21, 2002, Amateurs from Germany, Ireland and Canada will attempt two-way contact across the Atlantic, coincident with the Leonid meteor shower. They will attempt to use the ionized trails of meteors to reflect FSK441 signals across the Atlantic. Operating from SONRA'S Signal Hill station, VO1AA, St. John's, NL and the Kells in Ireland, the group will compete for the Brendan Trophies awarded by Irish Radio Transmitter Society.

Representing the Society of Newfoundland Radio Amateurs are Paul Piercey, VO1HE and Graham Dillabough, VO1DZA/VE6KJ who will be joined at Signal Hill by Harry Schleichert, DL2DAO. Operating from Ireland will be Tony Baldwin, EI2FSB, Tony Moore, EI7BMB, Nicolas Exner, DK5DQ and Volker Muehlhaus, DL5DAW.
