BROADBAND OVER POWER LINES (BPL)

The RAC has a new web page covering Broadband over Power Lines (BPL) which and this page will provide information on the development and implementation of this technology in Canada. The page also includes several links to different sources of information.

The use of the electrical power lines to carry high speed data poses a possible threat to HF amateur radio, because the digital signals carried by the power lines may interfere with radio reception in the amateur bands. The converse is also true. Amateur radio signals may be picked up by the power lines, and block the transmission of the digital data.

Power lines have traditionally been used to carry low speed data in the lf and vlf range, where radiation is much less likely to happen. The term used for these traditional systems is Power Line Communications (PLC) or Power Line Telecommunications (PLT). In Europe, the term PLC is also used for the Broadband data transmission, whereas in North America, the term Broadband over Power Lines (BPL)

is more commonly used.

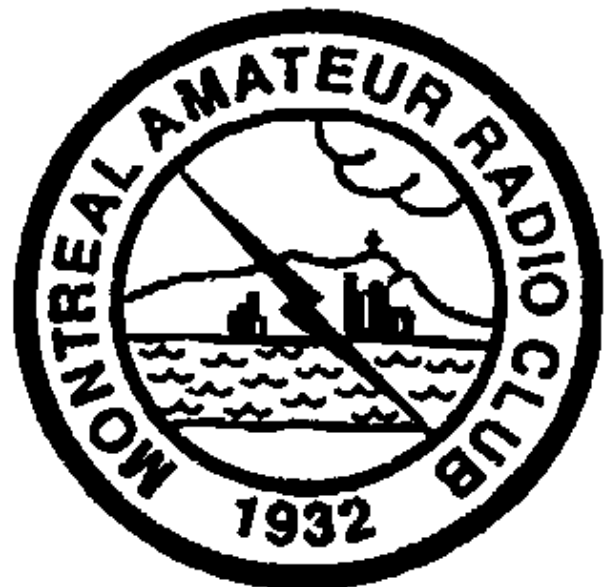
