I recently learned about a new government service called ALERT READY.


This service was inaugurated in April 2015 to advise citizens about impending emergencies via all communications

There are multiple web sites full of information about this service. You can access them all by googling READY.CA. This website was set up to explain the new system and how these alerts will be broadcast. Developed in partnership with federal, provincial and territorial emergency management officials, plus Environment Canada and the broadcast industry, Alert Ready is operated by The Weather Network.

The system delivers critical warnings to residents through television and radio, as well as through cable and satellite service providers.
